ATTENTION PASTORS, CHURCHES, CHURCH TREASURERS

PLEASE, PLEASE! Help our church! We are asking that all checks sent to support the Romania mission work be properly marked. Beginning December 1, all funds will be designated to the name(s) on the checks that come in to our church. If you mark your check Romania, the check will go to the Romania work fund. If you put "Raul," or "George" or "Pugh" or "Aurel Miclea" or "Aurel Munteanu," etc., on the check memo line, those funds will go to those people as personal support or love offering. If you mark your check "literature" it will go to the European Literature fund. We are adopting this policy so that we do not have to guess or rely on memory as to exactly where your funds are intended to go. Please help us with this!

SECOND: TO THOSE CHURCHES WHO HAVE SUPPORTED THE OKLAHOMA WORK.

Due to my (Bro. Pugh's) health and the closing of the Poteau mission work, our church now has Oklahoma Mission funds on hand. We are asking for your help in properly disposing of those funds. Dear Pastor and Churches,

Mission work. Last month Aurel, Miriam and I took some time off and flew to Sweden where we visited relatives and friends. After all the activities of the summer this was a welcomed time of "slowing down the engines." The work of Bros. Aurel Munteanu, George and Dumitru continued their work as usual. We appreciate their staying "by the stuff" for us!

As soon as we came back Aurel Miclea, Aurel Munteanu and I drove to Germany as I was asked to preach at a conference organized by Bro. Niko's group. The first stop of the trip was in Southwestern Germany near Stuttgart where we visited Sister Magda. We made it there after 15 hours of driving. We took a shortcut, getting off the main Autobahn ("Interstate") in Austria. After driving for an hour on a two lane road we crossed the border into Germany. We did this just to save time and fuel, but later we found out that there were big problems on the border that we had planned to cross: problems with the Syrian refugees that are trying to get to Germany. The Lord was good in watching over us and we made it there fine.

The following day, after a brief meeting with a sister in Sis. Magda's town, we started our trip north and visited sis. Elisabeth who translates literature for us into German. After that we drove about 250 miles to Bro. Niko's where we arrived late afternoon on Friday. We had fellowship on Friday night: had the service on Saturday and stayed with them until Sunday morning when we drove South again. We believe the Lord opened a door for the Word, both in preaching and in personal discussions while in the north. We met people from all over Germany, some from Netherlands, one man from Kazakhstan and another that works in the refugee camps in Sicily. He invited us there and told me that there are many Romanians in Sicily working in agriculture. We are seeking the Lord's direction in this.

Monday morning we started our trip back to Romania, and stopped to visit a family that attended our church in Bocsa but moved to Germany to find work. After this visit, we headed back and made it to Bocsa early Tuesday morning. It was a tiring trip, but fruitful we believe. Please pray for these people in Germany as they need both teaching and a direction in which to go now that they left the Arminian Baptist church there. We are concerned about them and try to be a good testimony to them.

Another matter of prayer is my proposed trip to Rome, Italy. I talked with the Brother that invited me, and he wants me to make a trip there to meet one another face to face and talk about the possibility for me (us) to go there regularly (once per month or so) to teach this group. I hope to be able to make that trip in the first part of December.

But before going to Rome, I need to make a trip to Moldova (Eastern Romania) and to Bucharest (the capital) as there are several people that showed interest and want to meet with us in these places. The roads in Eastern Romania are not so good, and I need to get there before winter sets in. Remember to pray for this trip, too, please. Pray for our missionary endeavors as we also pray that the Lord will open doors for each one of you! We need to be busy for the Lord, for His kingdom, for the sake of His wonderful Gospel. Times may change and we may not always enjoy the freedom we have now, so let us be thankful for it and use it for the Lord's honor!

Literature work. We have started reprinting several booklets and books that were out of stock and are preparing the new publications to print. We are getting ready to print Bro. Tom Ross' "Elementary Eschatology," Bro. Mark Fenison's "Baptism in the Spirit" and Arthur Pink's "The Sovereignty of God." We hope that these will be made available before the end of the year. We are waiting now for the service man to come as our big paper cutter in the print shop is not working properly. But as soon as we get it back running, we will start printing these books. Every time I write about the literature work, I feel just overwhelmed at what the Lord is doing through it and I am so thankful to all of you that are part of this work. It is through you, your prayers, and your financial support that make it possible. Thank you for all that you do for the truth in our part of the vineyard!
