She didn't have a lot of fine motor skills in her hands since that skill was rarely developed in people her age who never went to school to learn to read and write. She didn't speak English and I don't speak Duna, but we communicated through others, or with just a smile on our faces. Frank and I look forward to seeing her again in Heaven, and being able to communicate in a much better way as we praise God together.
