Brother Norman Malu has safely returned from his travel to the Highlands in Papua New Guinea and reports that the churches are doing well, though numbers in membership are less than in his past visits. He also reports that Pastor Wilfred Megeye of Tugu Baptist Church is beginning Bible study classes for a couple of young men who have a willingness to learn.

Thank you once again for your continued love, encouragement, prayers, and support for the Lord's work in Australia and Papua New Guinea.
